Report from the Executive Director

After a very fruitful year in 2016, the year 2017 began with HEI moving from an embryonic organization to a more focused and strategic Institution. Specifically, strategic partnerships with key government institutions including the Federal Road Safety Commission (FRSC), Lagos State Ambulance Service (LASAMBUS), National Orthopaedic Hospital Igbobi, and other key public hospitals, were formed. The highpoint of this strategic engagement was a formal letter by Lagos State Ministry of Health to its hospitals authorizing them to collaborate with HEI in our activities of which a copy of the letter was also sent to HEI.

The initiative 'None Should Die' was also launched in September 2017, a unique initiative aimed at ensuring critically injured road accident victims are stabilized and resuscitated at selected public hospitals with HEI assisting financially within 24 Hours thereby reducing fatalities occasioned by such accidents. Earlier, on July 26th 2017, a maiden Press Conference featuring over 12 Media Houses highlighting the activities of the organization was organized. Some of the over 160 beneficiaries were on hand to testify on the uncommon impact of HEI interventions in their lives. As a matter of fact, HEI made a difference in the lives of patients in over 22 Public Health Institutions in Lagos and Oyo States.

Consequently, HEI has established itself as one of the leading organizations that is responding to the health needs of low income communities, indigent patients/sick people and persons in vulnerable situations occasioned by road traffic accidents in such a short time. This was made possible from the continuous support received from organizations and individuals, who donated to our cause.

HEI's social intervention program and its positive impact on the vulnerable segment of the society began to elicit the support of Corporate Organizations during the year under review. In late 2017, Price Waterhouse Coopers (PwC) selected HEI among the Charities it supported that year and went further to make a significant financial donation.

This came after it carried out rigorous due diligence on the succor the organization's activities have brought to many, especially the poorest segment of the society.

I am pleased to report that part of the strategy taken by the organization during the year was to put in place international standards of reporting, accounting and auditing systems and a strict adherence to tenets of Corporate Governance which engenders confidence in our systems and operations.

I am particularly grateful to the Board of Trustees, Executive Members, our Intervention Assistant and all committed members who together joined hands and made huge sacrifices to ensure that this work is sustained. HEI PROGRAMS IN 2017

MEDICAL RELIEF

HEI continued to intervene in the lives of indigent and vulnerable people in 2017 by assisting them financially to meet their health needs. In the year under review, we placed our focus on children who are often the most vulnerable when their parents are indigent.

NONE SHOULD DIE

This initiative was launched late 2017. Aimed at accident victims, HEI decided to stand in the gap for these groups of individuals who are vulnerable at the time of a road traffic accident, supporting them financially and thus ensure that they are resuscitated and stabilized.

When we call on them to assist our accident patients, they respond and relieve us of the financial burden, especially for unconscious patients.



Fundraising and Income

HEI is largely dependent on donations from members and partners. We are glad to see our donor base expanding. Despite the challenging environment in 2017, HEI raised 7 million naira from donations from members and financial contributions from organizations including PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC). PwC donated 1million naira in December of 2017 to HEI.

Integrity is the key word for us at HEI. Every money spent is accounted for, and goes through an approval process. This ensures that expenses are properly vetted; Notwithstanding, this has not hindered the medical relief process through unnecessary bottlenecks. Approvals for verified cases are given no later than 24 hours.

Looking forward

HEI will continue to look for innovative ways to raise funds for projects including sourcing for grants, expanding the membership base, increasing collaborations with local and international organizations, and developing a business model around the Organization.

HEI encourages all Nigerians to support this cause and contribute to saving even more lives.



When Julia Nwagwu went to a hospital 10 days ago and was told she could not have her baby normally, she was in a state of despair. "I was told my blood pressure was too high and was referred to the federal specialty. When I got there, I was taken to the theatre and had a caesarean section after the surgery."

Julia had her baby safely, but three days later when the hospital brought the bill, they were unable to pay. "My husband was out looking for money everywhere. I had left my children at home for several days, and here I was, in hospital with my newborn, not able to go home because I could not pay."

Julia was really worried and upset. She went into labour and her blood pressure began to rise again. "I was crying. Then these people came around. They said they were back, an organisation called the Health Emergency Initiative (HEI), for indigent patients and wanted to help. I was very happy. I stayed in the hospital for one month until they paid my bills and I was released."

Julia is not the only one that has benefited from this initiative. Sara Ifeje, a young housewife, was several months pregnant when she was taken to the hospital. She was told she was in labour, and the next day she was in surgery. After three days, my case was classified as critical and I was referred for surgery. The doctor said something should be done urgently to save the pregnancy. I was taken to a health facility at Fashola for another hour. By the time we returned for the surgery, we had spent all the money that we had and we had no money again for the surgery. It was the HEI that came to my rescue and paid all my bills.

Another beneficiary, Aina, 30, whose daughter, Zainab, complained of a headache and sudden loss of consciousness and was taken to the hospital.

"She couldn't walk or walk or sleep her limbs. We took her to the Federal Medical Center, Badagry, where she was up to N10,000 were prescribed," Aina

agreed. Although Zainab was on the National Health Insurance Scheme (NHIS), it did not cover the drugs that she had to take at cost of N5,000 plus daily for 6 weeks.

"My husband and I had exhausted all our resources and we were unable to pay for the drugs. It was then someone introduced us to HEI who took over her case and paid for the drugs."

Millions of Nigerians live in poor conditions and a significant proportion of them are involved in people that cannot be discharged from hospital because they owe a bill as N2,000. So many are dying because they are unable to pay to obtain treatment even in government or public hospitals. But there are some voluntary programmes that set up initiatives and organisations to take care of the medical needs of the indigent.

One of such is the Health Emergency Initiative (HEI) for indigent patients.

The Initiative's Chairman, Board of Trustees, Dr. Rabi Ogunbiyi, said HEI has intervened in over 2,000 cases since inception and is signing Memoranda of Understanding with 41 public hospitals.

He observed that the provision of healthcare is an area of importance in Nigeria, and remarked that while HEI does provide assistance of prompt settlement of bills for the indigent to obtain access to health care in public hospitals.

"The HEI programme for indigent patients is especially for indigent Nigerians some of who do because they are unable to pay as little as N2,000 for medical bills. HEI also takes care of patients that are unable to settle their treatment bills and has intervened in about

150 patients in 10 hospitals.

"There is no hard and fast rule on the beneficiary. It is decided on a case-by-case basis. There is a needs-based initiative and support only. The beneficiary does not have to register or show anybody, but only has to qualify for the support to be provided."

Ogunbiyi explained that HEI is working to assist the indigent with health care services. "What HEI does is prompt settlement of bills to obtain access to health care in public hospitals. Medical health care is generally expensive and many are because they cannot afford it. The ordinary medical care is being made available to the indigent by HEI."

Further, the BCT Chairman said: "No health system can be functional if it does not obey three basic organisational rules of effectiveness, efficiency and equity. First, it must be effective, that is, it must do what it is supposed to do. Second, it must be efficient by doing it at the least cost possible. Third, there must be an equilibrium between the cost and quality."

According to Ogunbiyi, HEI is a voluntary agency driven by love seeking to become a powerful institution. "We cannot show greater love than by supporting someone that is about to die and the person requires love. The beneficiary must be truly indigent and the intervention is only in public and government hospitals for those who cannot access treatment. HEI has contacts with many hospitals and has intervened in Kaduna and Abia. When we hear about cases, we intervene."

In the last quarter of the year, HEI is

collaborating with the Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC), and selected government hospitals to bridge the gap between accident victims and prompt access to health care across the country. During the campaign, tagged "None Should Die", there would be guaranteed access to treatment for accident victims.

During the campaign, accident victims in critical condition brought in by the FRSC to the hospital would be immediately treated at the expense of the HEI.

"It is in guarantee access to treatment for accident victims. Effort will be made to ensure relief for continuity of treatment especially exceeding N20,000."

Ogunbiyi, however, said the initiative requires support from government agencies to build a support system, especially for the indigent and to give fast prompt treatment to road accident victims.

For the accident victim, there is no assessment. An accident victim needs a fast medical care. There is no debate. Every accident case requires fast care. Anybody that requires emergency but cannot access it will be assisted in this respect. It is not really about money."

Key Goals and Upcoming Projects

Reduction of maternal mortality in 2-3 states by at least 7% targeting over 1500 interventions.

This initiative would also cover extensive advocacy and sensitisation programme among women in rural and poor neighbourhoods. Vigorous awareness creation towards child spacing would also form part of the campaign. In order to achieve this, HEI has designed the 'Community to Facility' initiative; this project is targeted at women and children in low-income communities. It aims to encourage usage of local health facilities, build the capacities of these facilities to respond to basic health emergencies, and also increase knowledge of the focus group on common illnesses.

Over 2000 interventions aimed at reducing infant mortality.

Special attention would be given to children suffering from malnutrition, Cholera, and Malaria as these diseases are responsible for high incidence of recorded deaths of children between 0-5 years. HEI will focus medical interventions in its medical relief scheme in this age group.

Expansion of the HEI's "That None Should Die" Programme to four additional states.

This is aimed at bringing down post-crash fatalities caused by Road Traffic Accidents (RTAs) by 20% in 2018. Working closely with the FRSC and other government stakeholders, we intend to undertake advocacy in road safety. We have also designed a major project that interweaves health and transportation, with the hope that this will significantly impact on RTAs and reduce the number over the next 3 years.

Medical Intervention Outreach at Massey Hospital



Commencement of 'Project Joseph' aimed at providing basic medical assistance to inmates in selected Prisons in Lagos (Two prisons for the first phase).

This is limited to inmates with basic health challenges such as malaria, typhoid etc. HEI involvement here is strictly to support basic medical needs of the inmates. About 400 inmates would be reached through this scheme. The first phase of this project has already begun with the Kirikiri Medium Prison, where a needs assessment has been conducted, along with the donation of some medical items to the facility.

Key Goals and Upcoming Projects

HEI plans to hold medical outreaches in low income communities

This would ensure that the indigent and very poor residents in these communities access basic healthcare. Over 500 persons would benefit from each of the outreaches.

A strong volunteer community will be assembled for key projects.

These will include medical and non-medical volunteers/interns. HEI will engage them when the need arises to act in various capacities. The aim of this is to build a team of individuals who are committed to contributing to humanity. We intend to partner with youth-led organizations and engage other organizations such as the NYSC.

Finally, the existing intervention that supports indigent patients in public hospitals would be strengthened and reinvigorated.

At least 3 hospitals in each local government would be incorporated into the scheme to ensure wider coverage.

These goals would be driven on the strong pillars of a robust Monitoring & Evaluation (M&E) framework as well as detailed/transparent financial reporting.

Upcoming Projects

HEI has designed some socially impactful projects for 2018, in line with the organization's 3 year strategy. They include:

On The Spot Interventions:

This project is designed to provide succour to patients and offer them hope in their medical conditions at a snapshot; it is aimed at creating a platform with which to solicit for more funding support while increasing awareness on the needs of the vulnerable.

We also seek to create awareness on the health needs of public health institutions and advocate for increased government intervention.

The project will be implemented on a rolling basis throughout the year.

Empowering Youth Leaders to Curb Substance Abuse in Nigeria:

This project addresses the issue of substance abuse by empowering youth leaders. Teenage and youth leaders are targeted because of their strategic roles in influencing their peers. HEI believes that when this target group is rightly impacted, they will influence their peers positively.

Safety in Nigerian Transportation System (SINTS)', under the 'None Should Die' Initiative:-

As one of the leading NGOs responding to RTAs in Nigeria, HEI has designed the SINTS project, which seeks to implement safety procedures on the road and in commercial motor parks/transport companies across Nigeria. This initiative seeks to ensure:

- ★ Road users are aware of and engage in safe practices
 - ★ Drivers observe safe speeds
 - ★ Vehicles are safe.
 - ★ A workable framework that ensures that bystanders/Good Samaritans who genuinely assist crash victims to hospitals are not victimized or unjustly treated by law enforcement agents. This way post-crash fatalities would be significantly reduced
- We are absolutely committed to preventing and significantly reducing RTAs in Nigeria by 50% in 2020, in line with the SDG 3, which is 'good health and well being.'







Organizational Profile and Structure

Health Emergency Initiative (HEI) is an organization driven by the Love of Jesus Christ and stands in the gap for the poorest segment of Nigerian society, enabling them to obtain lifesaving medical care in public hospitals. It also provides succor to victims of Road traffic accidents and other emergencies.

The operation of the organization is gradually expanding nationwide. HEI noble objective is to save the lives of our people who are unable to pay for lifesaving medical care. HEI has in the short time of its existence since 2015, intervened to save the lives of over 250 patients and critically injured accident victims in the various government hospitals in Lagos State.

In collaboration with the Federal Road Safety Commission (FRSC), Lagos State Ministry of Health, LASAMBUS and selected public hospitals in Lagos, HEI recently launched a programme, 'None Should Die,' to enable critically injured road accident victims receive early phase of emergency care to resuscitate and stabilize them, and by so doing save thousands of lives. HEI is willing to collaborate with individuals and organizations by supporting this programme financially and otherwise. About 1700-3,000 victims are expected to benefit with a cost outlay of N70million naira.

HEI has put in place international standards of reporting, accounting and auditing systems and strives to ensure strict adherence to the tenets of Corporate Governance which engender confidence in our systems and operations.

Aims and Objectives

1. To provide quick, initial and instant financial cover, assistance/deposit for indigent patients, unable to provide immediate funds necessary to undergo/access immediate treatment and preliminary hospitalization prior to regular family assistance.

4. Provide and maintain periodic health related data to government agencies /bodies, donor groups, individuals and charity minded members of the public with a view to curtailing, minimizing and eradicating careless deaths during emergencies.
5. Partner with Health Management Organizations (HMOs) towards providing basic health insurance to the indigent segment of the population.
6. Promote and support health related research initiatives for the good of humanity and also liaise with medical groups both local and international to provide free and discounted healthcare delivery to the citizenry.
7. Support and promote initiatives and actions towards equipping hospitals with modern equipment and capacity building for personnel, with the primary aim of offering affordable health care.
